As we embark on a boating expedition through Desolation and Gray Canyons of the Green River, learn about the diversity and enduring legacies of cultures from descendants who maintain memories of, connections to, and traditions with the land.

Gendered knowledge significantly influences the way we view the world around us. Gain fresh perspectives about this magnificent cultural landscape, seen through the unique lenses of female leaders and experts.

FEATURING:

Autumn Gillard (Cedar Band, Paiute), is a specialist in Southern Paiute astronomy, ethnobotany, and culture. She shares stories of Indigenous histories that connect landscapes across the desert Southwest.

Georgie Pongyesva (Hopi) works in Cultural Resource Management across the Colorado Plateau. She presents her views from a Hopi perspective to address Traditional Ecological Knowledge (TEK) blended with western science.

Shanna Diederichs is an archaeologist for PaleoWest, bridging science-based interpretations of archaeological data to the public and finding ways to Protect the Past in Utah.
